## PUBLIC NOTICE SOLID WASTE FACILITY RULES REVISED AUGUST 8, 1989

Effective June 1, 1989, all Northfield Residents who intend to use the Town Solid Waste Facility or Town Beach must display a PUBLIC FACILITIES PERMIT on the inside windshield, lower left-hand corner of their vehicle(s).

PERMITS may be obtained AT NO CHARGE, from the Town Hall (Monday - Friday 8:30 - 5:00 and Tuesday evening 7:00 - 9:00. You must provide proof of residency, i.e. motor vehicle registration, driver's license and/or tax bill. (For residents who do not use their own vehicle to deliver refuse to the Facility, a temporary permit can be obtained from the Town Hall.)

REFUSE MUST ORIGINATE FROM THE TOWN OF NORTHFIELD AND IS FOR RESIDENTIAL USE ONLY - COMMERCIAL WASTE WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

Saturday 8:00 - 4:00

- \* NO HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE will be accepted at the Facility as the Town already provides curbside service to residential households.
- \* NO STUMPS, LOT CLEARING MATERIALS, LOGS OR TREE PARTS EXCEEDING 5" IN DIAMETER are accepted. Contact M & R Land Excavation (603-424-4485) for stump disposal in Tilton. Brush of 5" diameter or less and clean wood without paint is acceptable.
- \* NO AUTOMOBILE BODIES will be accepted. Contact a local salvage yard for disposal.
- \* NO COMMERCIAL CONSTRUCTION/DEMOLITION MATERIAL will be accepted. Contractors must make arrangements with a licensed hauler for disposal.

PROHIBITED MATERIALS: Explosives, gas, turpentine, paints, cleaning fluids, caustics, poisons, liquid asphalt, pesticides, herbicides or their products, stumps and lot clearing materials, highly volatile products, motor vehicles, boats and parts thereof (cars, trucks, motorcycles, busses, trailers, etc.), asbestos, batteries other than vehicle batteries, hazardous waste, pathological/biological waste, animal remains, sludge, cesspool or other human waste, or any material which in the opinion of Town personnel constitutes a serious hazard to other users, the property of the Town or employees will not be accepted. Anyone wanting to dispose of the materials listed above should seek guidance from the State Department of Environmental Services, (800-852-3345) or a private landfill (Turnkey - Rochester, NH (603-332-2386).

The Town reserves the right to reject any materials which it considers to be hazardous, unacceptable waste or detrimental to the operation of the Facility.

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS AT THE FACILITY ARE SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:

\* ONLY RESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION MATERIAL can be deposited in the 30 yard container (i.e. shingles, painted or pressure treated wood, drywall, paneling, plumbing fixtures, etc.) The amount of construction and demolition material may not exceed five (5) cubic yards. Contractors doing work (i.e. remodeling/repair) for a resident and want to deposit materials in the Town's container must first obtain a temporary permit from the Town. Contractors or residents may obtain a permit by providing an estimate of the amount of materials to the town's building inspector upon applying for a building permit. The disposal fee shall be \$20.00 per cubic yard and paid before the temporary hauling permit is issued.

\* SCRAP METAL: ALL ITEMS MUST BE SEPARATED AND FREE OF ALL WOOD, PLASTIC AND RUBBER. Tanks, drums or containers of any sort must have ends removed. No item shall be disposed in a bulky form, swing sets for example shall be dismantled and cut up if sections are too long. Refrigerators must have doors removed. Capacitors containing PCB's must be removed from refrigerators and air conditioners. Appliances, i.e. washers, dryers, refrigerators, stoves and water heaters, must be placed in their designated location. All other metal must be placed in separate piles according to the kind of metal for proper baling and disposal, i.e. #1 light iron, #2 light iron, cast iron, brass, copper, aluminum, heavy unshreddable metal.

\* Household furniture, mattresses, box springs, living room furniture, household appliances, etc. must be disassembled to no longer than 3 feet x 4 feet.

\* Tree limbs and tree parts up to 5" in diameter and wood without paint will be accepted for burning. Leaves and grass trimmings must be placed in compost pile.

\* Tires - rims must be removed and placed in metal pile. A fee of \$2.00 for each tire is charged and payable to the Facility Attendant prior to disposal.

\* Motor oil and vehicle batteries must be placed in their designated location.

FAILURE TO ABIDE BY THESE REGULATIONS OR FAILURE TO OBEY FACILITY ATTENDANT SHALL BE A VIOLATION AND DISPOSAL PRIVILEGES MAY BE REVOKED.

When the new RECYCLING AREA opens this fall, the following disposal fees will become effective: Car Tires \$3.00, Truck Tires \$7.00, Larger Tires \$10.00, Appliances \$10.00, Residential Demolition Material \$20.00 per cubic yard. Payment shall be made prior to disposal.
