SUBJECT MATTER DISCUSSED AND DECISIONS MADE: Town Administrator Robichaud spoke to the Selectmen about a resident on Street. The resident sent a letter to the Selectmen asking for a reduction in the fees that have been assessed because of his non-compliant mobile home that he had placed on his lot without a permit. The Mobile Home is too old to be certified by HUD and does not conform to the Town Zoning rules and regulations.

Town Administrator as they will stay the fines, only if she substantially removes the mobile home by February 22<sup>nd</sup> or face reinstatement of the fines and the fines will be recalculated back to the original date of the Zoning Board hearing.
