

The Clerk/Collector's office processed 858 transactions for motor vehicles and 55 transactions for boats in the month of April, as well as various transactions for Vital Statistics and OHRVs.

Dogs are required to be licensed by April 30<sup>th</sup> every year, making April a busy dog month. We licensed 283 dogs during the month bringing our overall total to 833 licensed dogs for the year so far. We participated in a rabies clinic that was held in the parking lot of town hall and sponsored by the local 4H Club. Both Kim and Becky from Tilton participated along side us to tag any of our town's dogs that may have gotten a rabies shot during the event. We do still have 434 dogs on our unlicensed list. Starting June 1<sup>st</sup> those that are unlicensed start accumulating a late fee of an additional \$1 every month they remain unlicensed. We will be providing a list in the first half of June of all the dogs we still have outstanding.

We attended training in April that was provided by the Secretary of State's office for new software that will be used for our elections going forward.

April was also the month we processed our annual tax liens for any outstanding 2023 property tax. We executed the lien on April 29<sup>th</sup> for a total of 64 properties with a total outstanding property tax amount of \$171,374.44. We also executed a lien for both the Tilton Northfield Sewer District and the Highlands Village District on the same day for outstanding bills owed to them. Making the total for the 2023 Lien \$177,652.30.

As of 04/30/24 our total unpaid receivable amount was \$295,588.86.

Our notices to property owners that still have an outstanding balance from 2021 were sent May 1<sup>st</sup> to inform them of the upcoming possible deeding if they remain unpaid.
